Online public schools are permanent, fully-online, and free educational options that teach students through digital classes.

Indiana has several free, full-time online learning options.
These include Indiana Connections Academy, Indiana Digital Learning School, Indiana Gateway Digital Academy, Phalen Virtual Leadership Academy, and Achieve Virtual.

The state does not require homeschooling parents to teach specific subjects and does not require standardized testing for homeschoolers.
